# General Information

Strawberry Field is a visitor attraction in the place that inspired The Beatles song 'Strawberry Fields Forever'.

It is owned and operated by The Salvation Army. It was originally a children's home.

Now it is a visitor attraction with a cafe, garden, giftshop and a training centre for young adults.

You can come and visit. There is a charge to enter the exhibition. You can buy tickets online or when you are here. You can enter the garden, cafe and giftshop for free.

## Getting here

Strawberry Field has two entrances from the street.

One is for people who are walking. It's next to the big red gates.

One is for cars. It's just up the hill and leads to the carpark.

Both entrances lead to the front door.

# Parking

Parking at Strawberry Field  
Liverpool is free.

There are lots of parking  
spaces and accessible parking  
spaces.

Sometimes the car park can be  
busy or get full.

If the carpark is full, there is  
parking nearby.





# The front door



The front doors lead into the shop.



You may be greeted by a volunteer.  
Volunteers wear red t-shirts.




# The shop



The shop is straight ahead when you walk in.

The shop can get quite busy, especially in the summer.



On the left is the ticket desk. This is where you can buy tickets or items from the shop.

There are sensory items here if you need them.

The staff are friendly.

They usually wear t-shirts from the shop with a red lanyard.

To go into the Visitor Exhibition, you will need to pay:

- Adults: £12.45
- Concessions: £9.45
- Children (age 16 and under): free of charge with a paying adult
- Carers: free of charge

# Visitor Exhibition



The visitor exhibition is through the double doors.

You will be given a media guide and headset that you can listen to. You can use your own headphones if you like.



Inside the visitor exhibition there are colourful boards and some videos playing.

They have information about The Salvation Army, Strawberry Field and John Lennon.

# The Café

In the café you can sit where you want. It can get quite busy in the summer and there will be music playing.

A member of staff will bring you a menu. They will be wearing all black.

Sometimes the staff will be trainees. They will be wearing a t-shirt that says 'Trainee'.

When you know what you want to eat or drink, you can go up to the counter to order and pay.

- Men's toilets
- Women's toilets
- Baby change

# The garden

You can get to the garden through the glass doors in the café.

There is a ramp and a set of stairs that lead you to the ground level.

In the garden you will see:

- The Bandstand
- The Ukrainian Peace Monument
- The hope hut and labyrinth
- An etching of the old Victorian building
- The original gates
- Sir George and Lady Judy Martin Rose Garden



# Quiet space



Downstairs is the prayer room. You can go here if you need a quiet space.

You can get there by going down the corridor and down the stairs, or by using the lift.
